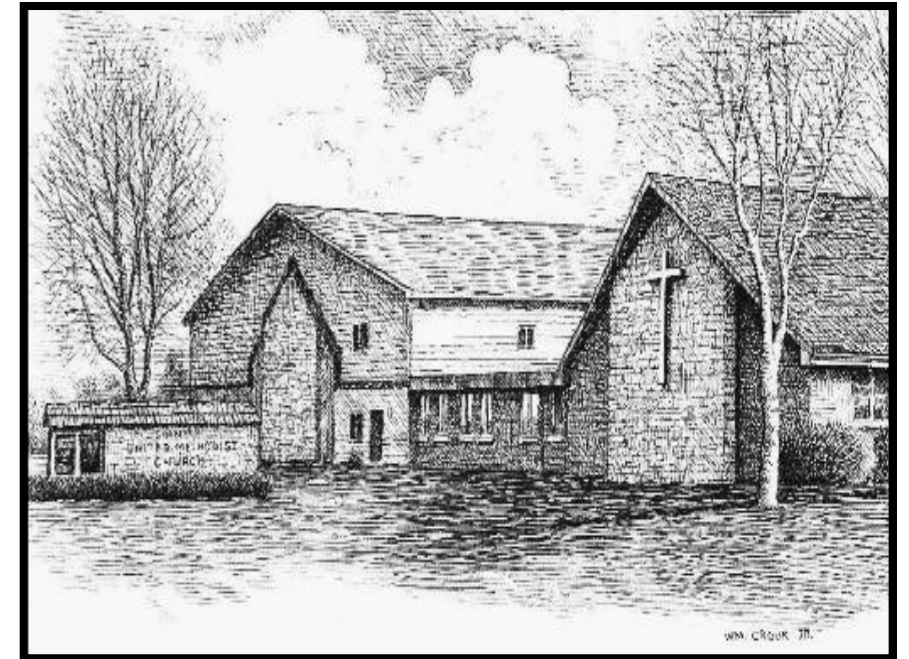

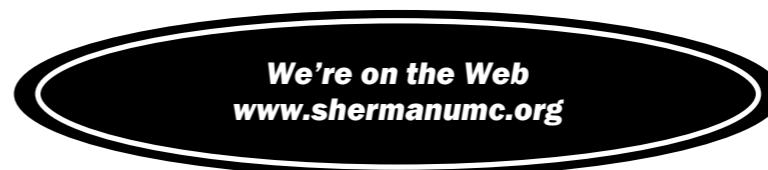

Tithing and the General Fund

Like a business, a church operates on revenue in order to exist. But unlike a business the church is a ministry. Therefore, a church does not charge for its services. It cannot force anyone to give. The church is a venture of faith that depends upon the free will offering of its members and friends who are devoted disciples of Jesus Christ, who care for the redemption of the world and who want to give back to God in gratitude for all that God has done for them.

The traditional level of support for the church's ministry is the tithe or 10% of one's take home pay. Because the financial circumstances of God's people vary, we are not asked to give in equal amounts, but in equal proportion by making the tithe (10%) our goal.

The tithe is the first level of giving to the General Fund which covers the expenses for all the ministries which make a church a church. It pays for utilities, curriculum, staff salaries, routine repairs and maintenance, conference apportionments and all other operational expenses so that the church can have worship and Sunday School, children and youth programs, pastoral care, weekday ministries, scouting, administration, music, weddings, funerals, family celebrations and other activities.

In order for the church to be available when needed, steady and faithful giving to the General Fund on a regular basis is a necessity. Attendance fluctuates up and down throughout the year, but expenses are constant. Because attendance sags during the summer the General Fund typically hits a low point during September or October. Currently the church is operating on a week to week basis with no cushion in the General Fund.

Please pray about how you might be able to help restore and maintain a healthy balance in the General Fund by considering the following options:

Pray for God to lead you in considering the level of your support.

If you are behind on your planned giving this year, please make an effort to make it up as soon as possible, if your income permits.

If your income permits, consider increasing your giving to the church by one per cent of your take home pay.

Make a Special Gift.

God bless you for all your past support and all that you are able to do now to help the Sherman UMC fulfill its mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Thank You!

Kids' Place Teacher: Sherman United Methodist Church is looking to hire a teacher for it's after-school program. Hours would be 2pm-5:30/6pm Monday through Friday. Christmas Break and Spring Break the program is not in session, as well as other scheduled holidays on the calendar when the children do not attend. The ideal candidate would have first aid/cpr training, 6 hours child development or enrolled in higher education, age 21 or older, have a passion for sharing Christ, and love working with a group of 20 4th/5th grade students. The job would require helping with homework, planning/ implementing activities for 45 minutes each day, and supervising free play. Interested applicants can apply at Sherman United Methodist Church, 2336 East Andrew Rd., Sherman, IL between the hours of 8:30am and 5:30pm. Please ask for Carmen Arberger. Position opens January 2012.

Open Part time cleaning position – The church is seeking to employ a person for 3-4 hours on Sunday evenings to clean part of the church. The current compensation is \$41.60 per Sunday. 

Directions for Accessing SUMC Online Info

1. Go to www.shermanumc.org
2. Go to “links” section on left side of main screen and click on “individual membership data.”
3. A sign in screen will appear. The FIRST TIME you visit you will need to click on “Need a log in.” The computer will ask you for your email address and first/last name. The computer will then match you to information that has been entered for you by SUMC. If a match is found, the computer will email you a password. If a match is not found and you have more than one email address, you may need to try again. If you still don't have a match, it means that SUMC doesn't have the correct info for you and you must contact Erin at SUMC (496-2338). Once Erin has entered your info, you should be able to find a match the next time you log in. Once you have a password you can sign in on sign in screen and the program will take you to your very own personal page. Only you will see your page so please keep your password private.
4. On your personal page you can view your complete profile, make additions/corrections, tell us your preferences for contacting you, see your giving history, and print out a church directory. **Please note that once you make a change to your that it must be approved by the web administrator before it goes into effect permanently.

Responding to the Need applies to those of you who give to our soup donations each month.

Thank you! Each month we have been able to supply Kumler Outreach Ministries with 360 cans of soup and more thanks to your generosity. Also a huge dose of appreciation goes out to all of you who in some way supported the Fall Chicken Dinner. As you know, all of the proceeds from this dinner go to mission. We will share the results of the missions supported as the numbers become available.

Meanwhile, we are planning for Christmas. We have 2 projects that you’ll hear more about in November. The Angel Tree, to date, has 20 names of children in need of clothes. They range in age from 18 months to 14 years. The children are in five families. Let’s think of them as part of our family. If you want to adopt a child that will be great, or if you would rather give money we will shop for you. Kumler is asking for one outfit per child. Toys are received from other agencies. Look for the Angel Tree to be up before Thanksgiving so we can get the gifts to the sponsors by Dec. 9th.

Also, we are encouraging you to give a gift that will change the world this Christmas by giving a gift to mission. You could start a new family tradition of giving. Put one less box under the tree and donate the amount of that gift to mission, give in memory or in honor, forego the extended family t-shirt exchange for something meaningful. We’ll have information on the names and addresses for suggested giving plus special cards to give put on or under the tree. No amount is too great or too small to give to someone in need.

SAVE USED POSTAGE

You may have wondered about or are not even aware of the container in the Narthex marked “Marion Mission Storehouse.”

Donations of used postage stamps (cut from envelopes, with at least 1/2” border of paper) go towards shipping costs for missionary supplies.

From the first shipment of eyeglasses and rolled bandages back in 1967, to the present day container of industrial equipment, supplies and used clothing that left Marion, IN, the second week of January 2011 on its journey to Africa, the Marion Mission Storehouse (MMS) continues to be a vital connection in the life and work of the UMC in Africa. In the past 10 years along, over 2 million pairs of shoes have been shipped and found new feet and life in Africa! The containers of used clothing have reached remote villages, and the shoes have helped children to live without the parasites that come from going barefoot.

They try to ship on average 2 forty-foot containers per year. The cost of shipping these containers varies from \$15,000 to \$20,000 per container. MMS is also an advance special of the Indiana Conference of the UMC.

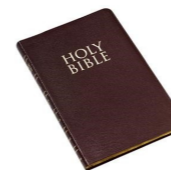
